The common findings in most of these incidents are (1) 500 meter zone checklist not filled up and (2) Vessels did not carried out Risk Assessment before carrying out their

These are normal procedure which all vessels need to carry out. In view of this, I wish to remind all vessel to carry out these procedure each and every time. By doing this, you are operating more safely and incident free. Please be safe than sorry.


